COVID-19 GUIDELINES

FORMAT

The format is 36-holes of stroke play at Norfolk Country Club. The lowest four scores of each team each round shall count towards the team score. The team with the lowest score for 36-holes will be the team champion. The individual with the lowest score for 36-holes will be the individual champion. Any tie for team and/or individual champion will be played-off as follows:

a) Tie for team championship—teams will play-off hole-by-hole, scoring all five scores on each hole, until a winner is determined.

b) Tie for individual championship—individuals will play-off hole-by-hole until a winner is determined.

TEAM REGISTRATION

Coaches should register Friday upon their arrival at Norfolk Country Club. Registration will be located in the cart staging area on the East side of the Clubhouse from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Schools will be responsible for paying their team (\$300) and individual (\$60) entry fees (payable to the NGA) either in advance or at registration.

Coaches will be sent the NGA Assumption of Risk, Waiver, Release, and Hold Harmless Agreement and the NGA COVID-19 Certification that each coach and player <u>MUST</u> fill out and turn in at registration.

PRACTICE AREAS

Practice areas will be available prior to play each day of competition. Complimentary range balls will be available on the driving range for competitors use.

SCORING

Scorecards will not be used during the tournament. Digital (online) scoring will be used in place of scorecards through the USGA Tournament Management (USGA TM) app. Players are asked to download the USGA TM app prior to the start of their first round. Complete instructions on how to download the USGA TM app, login, and keep score will be sent to coaches prior to the start of the tournament. Upon completion of the round players will enter the designated scoring area to review and verify their scores verbally with the marker and scoring official.

CARTS AND COACHES

Automotive transportation is complimentary to a single coach during the competition. Each team will be designated one cart stationed for pick-up just outside the clubhouse. These carts will be labeled with the name of the school. Use of carts is restricted to coaches only. A coach using a cart cannot appoint someone to drive the cart.

GROUPINGS AND STARTING HOLES

Round one groupings and starting holes will be e-mailed to coaches Thursday, October 8. This information will also be available on the tournament web site. Round two groupings and starting holes will be based upon round one scores. Both rounds will begin with a shotgun start, Friday at 1 p.m. and Saturday at 10 a.m. Golfers and coaches should meet near the large practice putting green 15 minutes prior to play each day for any necessary announcements and transportation to starting holes.

PLAYER'S DINNER FRIDAY EVENING

The NGA and Norfolk Sports Council will host a burger dinner for all participants and coaches Friday evening following play.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE SERVICE

Norfolk Country Club will be open for food & beverage service during the tournament. Team coolers are allowed for snacks and fruit. All other food and beverages must be purchased in the clubhouse; outside food and beverages other than snacks and fruit are prohibited. The NGA will provide ice chests with bottled water at both the first and tenth tees; in addition, the club has multiple water coolers located throughout the golf course.

DRESS CODE

Players must be neat in appearance with respect to clothing and personal grooming. The Committee in charge shall decide whether this requirement has been met, and has authority to withdraw the entry of a player who does not comply. **Absolutely No Metal Spikes.**

TEAM CHAMPION: Trophy and Gold Medal for coach and team members. INDIVIDUAL CHAMPION: Trophy and Gold Medal. INDIVIDUAL RUNNER-UP: Silver Medal. TOP TEN INDIVIDUALS: Bronze Medal.
