NOTICE TO PLAYERS

(This notice supplements the Local Rules and Terms of Competition for USGA Championships)

- 1. Ground Under Repair and Other Abnormal Course Conditions:**
 - a. Include but are not limited to:
 - i) Decorative flower beds.
 - ii) Young trees defined by white tubing and/or stakes.
- 2. Immovable Obstructions:**
 - a. Include but are not limited to:
 - i) All artificially surfaced roads and paths, including any adjacent curbing.
 - b. Immovable obstructions adjacent to, within or abutting each other, such as artificially surfaced paths (including decorative areas enclosed by these paths), curbing, walls, steps and drains, are considered a single obstruction.
 - c. Clubhouse, pool, permanent restrooms and pump house, including adjacent and surrounding artificially surfaced paths, curbing, walls, steps, patios, fences and/or decorative plantings, are considered a single obstruction.
 - d. White Stakes used to define out of bounds along the left of hole #4 and the right of hole #18 are deemed to be immovable obstructions during play of any other hole.
- 3. Immovable Obstructions Close to Putting Greens:** Model Local Rule F-5 is in effect. Relief is only available when both the obstruction and the ball lie in a part of the general area cut to fairway height or less.
- 4. Movable Obstructions:**
 - a. Include but are not limited to:
 - i) Staking and roping; trash cans; benches; and beverage coolers.
- 5. Out of Bounds:**
 - a. Defined by the nearest inside edge of white stakes.
 - b. Hole #1 - Out of bounds is defined by the wood fence posts right of the green, in addition to white stakes.
 - c. Hole #4 - Out of bounds is defined by white stakes along the left side during play of that hole only.
 - d. Hole #6 - Out of bounds is defined by white stakes behind the green. A ball coming to rest beyond the white stakes is out of bounds, even if it comes to rest on another part of the course that is in bounds for other holes.
 - e. Hole #7 - Out of bounds is defined by the wood posts along the left side, in addition to white stakes.
 - f. Holes #10 & #13 - The driving range on the right side, defined by white stakes, is out of bounds.
 - g. Hole #18 - Out of bounds is defined by white stakes and dots along the right side during play of that hole only.
- 6. Penalty Areas:**
 - a. **Dropping Zones** - If a ball is in the following penalty areas, including when it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found came to rest in the penalty area, the player has these relief options, each for one penalty stroke:
 - i) proceed under Rule 17.1; or
 - ii) as an additional option, drop the original ball or another ball in the dropping zone (marked "DZ") in the location below. The dropping zone is a relief area under Rule 14.3
 - Holes #3, #8 & #18 Red Penalty Area - DZ located on a forward tee.
- 7. Temporary Immovable Obstructions (TIOs):** Model Local Rule F-23 is in effect. TIOs include but are not limited to: USGA/NGA signage and tents.
 - a. **Special Relief Procedure - Either Side Relief:**
 - i) If a player is allowed relief under the TIO Local Rule, the player may take relief without penalty on either side of the TIO.
- 8. Transportation:** During the round, a player or caddie must not ride on any form of motorized transportation except as authorized or later approved by the Committee. A player who will play, or has played, under penalty of stroke and distance is always authorized to ride on motorized transportation.
- 9. Play-Off:** In the event of a play-off to determine the final qualifying spot(s) or alternate spots, concerned players shall immediately play-off hole-by-hole until qualifying spots are determined. The play-off rotation will be holes #17 and #18.
- 10. Scoring Area:** A scorecard is deemed to be returned when the player has left the scoring tent.
- 11. Teeing Area:**
 - a. Blue USGA tee-markers define the teeing area for the girls.
 - b. White USGA tee-markers define the teeing area for the boys.
- 12. Pace of Play Review Committee:** Sam Oehm, Bob Planansky and Ben Vigil.
- 13. Final Decisions on Disputed Points** will be made by Sam Oehm, Bob Planansky and Ben Vigil.
